PUBLIC HEALTH DEPT. REPORT

That the public schools should be safe for children all will admit but how many parents take the time to make a personal investigation for the purpose of ascertaining the truth and learning for themselves that their children will be protected from disease while they are at school.

Parents have the right to insist that the public schools shall be safe places for their children.

It has long been a recognized fact that the public schools serve as a center of exchange for contagious diseases which pass from pupil to pupil. This can be prevented if parents will interest themselves in the public schools and see that their children are protected from disease. The closing of school, when it has been exposed to a contagious disease, is not sufficient. It is better to isolate those infected and maintain a thorough inspection so that those remaining shall be protected from further danger.

When medical inspection and examination of schools and school children has been conducted properly good results have been evident. Epidemics have been checked, or avoided, and teachers and parents have come to know that under this system it is safe to keep the school open; that the children are safer in the school than at home, or about the streets or in picture shows.

With medical examination of school children many have been found suffering from physical defects that the parents have overlooked, and with medical examination nothing is done for the child other than to call the parents' attention to these defects, leaving it to the parents to see to the correcting of the same. When examinations have been made in these schools it has been found that there were many children with defective vision and hearing that seriously effect them in their school work, and attention has been drawn to enlarged glands, tonsils, adenoids and bad teeth, and the influence they have upon the welfare, happiness and mental vigor of school children.
