Holes of Guthrie and Earl McGowan of Tahlequah were named as appraisers of the segregated surface lands of the Choctaw and Chickasaw nations. Dr. Edgington will be chairman of the commission. The pieces pay \$1500 a year each.

## OWEN MAKES SPEECH IN FAVOR OF ROADS.

Washington, April 9.—Senator Robert L. Owen of Oklahoma addressed the senate Monday, advocating Senator Swanson's bill to appropriate \$20,000,000 annually for five years to aid the state and local committees in the improvements of public roads. The bill provides for the construction, maintenance and improvement of post roads and rural delivery routes through the co-operative and joint action of the national government and the several states in which such roads may be established.
