TWO HOUSES DESTROYED

Last night at 7:30 o'clock fire broke out at the home of John Dean, 1413 Shepard street, which resulted in the total destruction of that and the adjoining house, 1415 Shepard.

The houses were both located outside the fire limits and it was impossible to save either, though by the use of chemicals the fire was prevented from spreading to other structures.

The origin of the fire is not known, as the buildings were a mass of flames when the department arrived, and Mr. and Mrs. Dean were away from home. The house at 1415 Shepard was vacant and belonged to Earl Baker. Both structures were covered by insurance.
