

CONFERENCES OF CHURCH PASTORS END HERE TODAY

Methodist Stewards and Pastors Hold Sessions; 25 Charges of District Are Represented by 29 Delegates.

The district conference of stewards and pastors of the Methodist church closed here this morning at 11 o'clock.

Dr. Frank Roach, of Oklahoma City, missionary secretary of the state, delivered the principal address at the opening of the conference yesterday evening at 7:30 o'clock in the local M. E. church. "Missions" was the topic of Dr. Roach's address.

Rev. J. W. Sims, presiding elder of the Chickasha district, presided over the conference this morning when a round-table discussion concluded the meeting. Elder Sims made the announcement of the constructive program to be carried out in the district during the ensuing year.

Twenty-five charges were represented in the conference by twenty-nine delegates. The next session is subject to the call of the presiding elder.

The district includes all territory from Minco to Red River, and as far east as Pauls Valley. Verdon, Tuttle and Pocomas are included.

Can't Catch The Real Flu Twice

Paris, Nov. 19. (By Mail).—If you had the real Spanish Flu back in 1918 and 1919, and didn't die of it you won't have it again.

You can start in the winter with a perfectly light heart and no worry whatsoever as to how you would treat yourself in the event of a fresh attack—now that the time honored whisky and quinine cure is no longer integrally available.

This is the solemn and scientific assurance of Professor C. Dopter, of the famous Val-de-Grace hospital at Paris. He has just published the full statistics and reports of the hospital on the Spanish Flu epidemic since its original arrival in 1918 and which demonstrate conclusively that one attack of the disease establishes immunity.

In other words, the disease itself creates within the victim, if he doesn't die, a transformation of the organism which renders it impossible for the same cause to produce the same effects as regards the disease in question.

From the standpoint of statistics Professor Dopter points out that the Spanish Flu of 1918 and 1919 came in two waves. It was quickly demonstrated that those who had the disease during the first wave did not contract it during the second. This has proved equally true in all subsequent epidemics. This also explains the fact, noted almost everywhere that aged people placed in microbe-infested surroundings resisted better the disease than young people who not yet had a chance to become immune.

The conclusions drawn from these statistics and observations have also demonstrated their truth by ex-

periments conducted by Professor Dopter. Volunteer patients who were given an injection of flu microbes came down with the disease in four days. The experiment tried later on the same individuals produced no result whatever, their organisms having become immune.

HUNS WOULD SAVE COWS.

Berlin. (By Mail).—In connection with its protest against the Patent's demand for delivery of \$21,359 milk cows, the German government

prepared figures showing Germany had in June of this year, 7,334,418 cows, but estimated their output at 10 liters instead of 25 as in pre-war times. The Patent's demand was for the delivery of one above named figure in four years, but Germany contends its milk situation is such that this would bring it to a point where the already high infant mortality would be seriously increased. The cows are demanded by France, Belgium, Serbia and Italy, as repayment for cows taken by the Germans during the war.
