There are newspapers stupid enough to think that the taxation of the sugar was a violation of the Democratic platform. As a matter of fact the Democratic pledged of enacting a tariff for revenue only made the taxation of sugar necessary. The sugar schedule of the new tariff law neither benefits the trust nor violates the Democratic platform. —Kansas City Times.
