After his graduation from Yale university the young man decided to equip himself with a thorough practical knowledge of every branch of railroad work. Donning a pair of overalls and jumper, he worked side by side with ordinary mechanics spending two years' time in the motive power and civil engineering department of the New York Central Railway. He is an expert mechanic, and has already perfected several inventions which have come into use as improvements in railway equipment. One of these inventions is a device for use on locomotives which has the effect of facilitating the removal of the fire box from an engine, thus expediting the work of cleaning the fire box. At Ada—Begins September 25, 1903 holds two weeks, and February 17 1904, holds three weeks.

At Tishomingo—Begins October 19, 1903, and holds two weeks, and March 1, 1904, and holds three weeks.

At Chickasha—Begins November 2, 1903, and March 22, 1904, each term two weeks.

At Ryan—Begins November 16, 1903, and April 5, 1904, one week each term.

At Purcell—Begins November 23, 1903, and April 12, 1904, each term one week.

At Pauls Valley—Begins Nov. 30, 1903, and April 19, 1904, three weeks at each term.

At Ardmore—Begins December 21, 1903, and May 10, 1904, seven weeks each term.
