

SOME KIDDIE TO GET REAL PRIZE

Tiny but Perfect Home to Be Given Away at the Home Exposition

A \$1,700 SOUVENIR

Every Child Attending Better Homes Show Will Get One Chance at House

Some Tulsa boy or girl will be made especially happy by the modern home and builders exposition. For when it is over, he or she will possess one of the finest playhouses ever built—a playhouse constructed as substantially as a modern home and finished with even greater care and precision.

Through the Real Estate exchange which is sponsoring the exposition, Blair brothers, local home builders, will give away without cost the unique and perfect miniature home that is to be one of the exposition's most interesting features. This house, which may easily be entered and occupied by a boy or a girl, was constructed at a cost of \$1,700. Several local firms furnished the lighting fixtures and other appliances, which like the house itself, were manufactured especially for the miniature, the scale of which is exactly one-third that of an ordinary home built on a regular lot.

Each boy or girl under 13 years old that attends the exposition will be given a ticket good for one chance on the house. No charge will be made for these slips. Slips bearing printed numbers corresponding to the body of the ticket will be deposited in a sealed barrel. At the close of the exposition a number will be drawn and the youngster holding the corresponding number gets the house without the payment of a cent.

It can then be removed to the home of the winner and placed in a convenient spot for a playhouse. Built as solidly as a full-sized house, it will withstand all sorts of weather and be a possession of permanence. At the exchange meeting at Ed Wences, cafe Thursday noon it was decided to ask all who can visit the exposition during the afternoon of the week from October 29 to November 4, so the anticipated crowds at night may be avoided. This especially applies to boys and girls.
