Massachusetts Democrats to Demand Stand of All Candidates on Question WASHINGTON, Dec. 29.—Representative Gallivan, democrat, Massachusetts, declared in a statement today that democrats who go before the party caucus as candidates for speaker of the house in the new congress will be called upon by northern democratic representatives to say where they stand on the question of the Ku-Klux Klan. "Mark you," said Gallivan, "we are going to watch Ku-Klux democrats from the southland, whether they come from Texas or any other state and they will get no support from democrats in the north unless at the caucus, which will be called to select the party candidate for the speakership, these men pronounce their absolute and unequivocal opposition to the infamous organization which at present holds the front page in our daily newspapers."

Non-Political Body of Finance Experts of Nations, Idea of the President WASHINGTON, Dec. 29.—Appointment of American financiers to sit upon a commission such as suggested tonight by Secretary Hughes in his address at New Haven would be on nomination of the government if the proposal for this method of adjusting the reparations dispute was accepted abroad. This was the view expressed authoritatively in White House circles in connection with Mr. Hughes' remarks. It was pointed out that anybody of an advisory character to deal with the question of the amount of reparations Germany could and should pay must meet under the sanction of all governments involved, if its work were to have any effect. It was thrown upon preliminary conversations that may have been held between the Washington and the allied governments relative to the plan of operation Mr. Hughes has disclosed, the impression given in White House circles was that such conversations had taken place and that there was reason to believe the allied powers would not be found opposed to the suggestion if they fall to reach a reparations agreement among themselves.
