Funeral of C. L. Herbert.
Under a profusion of floral wreaths and flowers, the remains of the late Hon. C. L. Herbert were laid to rest in Rose Hill cemetery yesterday afternoon. The funeral was one of the largest ever seen in Ardmore. The obsequies were held under the auspices of the Masonic lodge of which deceased was a prominent member. Hundreds who knew Judge Herbert intimately in his life time came to pay tribute to one who was held in the highest esteem and in reverence. The floral offerings were indeed beautiful and costly and the casket was completely hidden with flowers.
The cortege moved to the Christian church where impressive services were held with manifestations of sorrow. Rev. Black paid a fine tribute to the memory of the deceased, and the audience was visibly affected by his remarks. At the grave the ritual of the Masonic order was carried out and all that was mortal of Judge Herbert was consigned to its final resting place.

Several out of town attorneys attended the funeral, Judge Herbert was widely known in the Southern district and his friends lamented his death. With him honor was the highest sense of justice that the human mind could conceive. He believed in righteousness and the best impulses of his heart beat in the direction of good. He stood for the elevation of mankind and he was a noble man in every sense of the word. In his death there has been removed one of the best citizens Ardmore ever possessed.
