#### NEGRESS GETS TEN YEARS.

**Edna Commander Convicted of Murdering Nathan Martin.**

Sapulpa, I. T., March 28.—In the district court at Sapulpa yesterday Edna Commander was given ten years for the murder of Nathan Martin. Both are colored and the murder took place at Martin's eating and rooming house in the east part of Tulsa last summer. The case is said to have a bearing on the mail sack robbery which occurred at the Frisco station a few weeks before the murder.

The Commander woman was an intimate friend of "Black Pearl," who with Charlie Green, colored, is doing time for this robbery. It is alleged Black Pearl said she would free Green if the charge if she had to kill the witnesses for the prosecution to do it. Martin was one of the principal witnesses for the prosecution and the general opinion is that Edna Commander murdered Martin at the instigation of the other woman.

#### OIL STRUCK AT LAWTON.

**Good Flow Encountered by Drillers at Depth of 110 Feet.**

Lawton, Ok., March 28.—At the depth of 110 feet yesterday afternoon the Lawton Natural Gas company struck a good flow of oil upon their holding in the Beal addition. The well is being sunk only twenty-five feet from the point at which a good flow of oil was secured a year or more ago. Every time the ball was lowered and brought to the surface it contained oil and oil sand. The managers of the company expected to keep drilling all night, but on account of the non-arrival of another driller the work was closed down at midnight. Drilling was resumed at noon today and it is their intention to operate the drill with a day and night shift in the future. This strike has given the company great encouragement.
