

NOT AFRAID OF UNION LABOR.

Republicans Do Not Fear Threat Made by Gompers.

A special to the Herald from Washington says: Republican leaders in congress have had time to grasp the full significance of the words of Samuel Gompers, who threatened to ask the ruling strength of the American Federation of Labor for the defeat of the party in power because of the indifference of congress to labor's interest.

The significance of the labor leader's words, however, does not seem to be grasping the Republican leaders in the least, notwithstanding the fact that the congressional campaign is an issue of the hour before them. The truth is—and Mr. Gompers knew it when he spoke as plainly as Mr. Gompers—that no politician, Republican or Democrat, believes that it is in the power of the labor leader to prevent the carrying of the party to power with a large number of the ballots of the laboring men.

Leaders in the house today are told by one another that it is the same old story of a threat to do something which never will be done simply because it never can be done.

"That said negligence was not willful or malicious."

"That said operator Hively should have been described his post of duty."

"That no criminal prosecution should be against Hively or the railroad by reason of said collision."

Another Stay for Patrick.

Albany, N. Y., March 28.—Senator Smith of Colorado today introduced two bills the effect of which will be to give Albert T. Patrick a stay of execution. One of the bills provides that when a judgment of death has been affirmed by the court of appeals and a motion for a new trial on the ground of newly discovered evidence has been denied in the court which rendered the judgment, an appeal may be taken to the court of appeals upon service of a notice upon the clerk of the original court in which a notice of appeal is filed to transmit the notice and the papers therein to the clerk of the court of appeals within ten days.
