THE CITY COUNCIL

ANOTHER INTERESTING SESSION HELD MONDAY.

Many Accounts Allowed—The Cemetery Matter Nearing Solution. Concession for Camping Ground for Chautauqua Granted.

The city council met in regular session at 2 o'clock yesterday afternoon. Muller and Randol were absent.

The following accounts were allowed and ordered paid:

The matter of the Downard Asphalt company's proposition to pave the intersection of Caddo and Main same as other crossings are paved and give same guarantee for \$260 was passed until next meeting.

Dr. McCoy's request for the return of a portion of his 1903 taxes was granted in part in accordance with a special report from the equalization board.

Alderman Fraley requested the removal of a building on lot 9 in block 320 that juts ten feet into the street. The matter was referred to the police to have same moved.

Alderman Whittington read a report from Robert Scates, the engineer at the pump station, which shows an increase in the amount of water pumped and at an expense of 3.7 cents per 1,000 gallons.

Mayer Dick said in reference to the portion of the cemetery that has been allotted that the alderman, O. B. Bailey was willing to have his filing cancelled and that under the circumstances he believed T. B. Nesides, chairman of the commission to the five civilized tribes, would cancel it. The cemetery committee should agree with some intermarried to allow it to be sold to the city.

The mayor informed the council that A. Walcott had expressed a willingness to allot it and dispose of it to the council for a stipulated sum. Rev. C. C. Welch, A. C. Cruise and Sam Noble appeared before the council to ask a concession for a camping ground on the city's lake property for the purpose of holding a chautauqua and Bible school here next July.

Mr. Weita said that three members of the Synod of Indian Territory and Oklahoma had been here and visited the lake, and they consider that there is no other spot so favorable in the two territories for the permanent location of the Summer Bible School as the city property north of the reservoir. The committee was of the opinion that the movement means a great deal for Ardmore. A summer school prompting the attendance of 1,000 people, with an auditorium at the lake for day services and an auditorium in town for evening services, and a probability of making it permanent is an enterprise that the town should put forth an extra effort to secure. On motion of Alderman Whittington the council by unanimous vote granted the concession requested.

Col. D. B. Lester was present and asked for a gas franchise. A copy of the franchise was read and the matter referred to the ordinance committee and city attorney for their report at a special meeting next Monday. Col. Lester said that his company was now putting in a similar plant at Shawnee, that they were financially able to put in the plant and that they would begin the work before the first day of December.

A petition was read from Chas. Milnes. Mrs. Hall and Mrs. Williams asking the privilege of laying a water pipe in the alley to the rear of their resident lots. The matter was deferred until the special meeting.

The resignation of Bob McGee as city scavenger was read by the clerk and accepted by the council.

Fraley Bros. was granted the contract for making the changes ordered in the construction of the city hall.

The police judge reported collections from all sources during July the sum of \$475.81; for the same month the tax assessor reported having collected \$925.81.
