POISON IS FOUND IN SWOPE'S LIVER

CHICAGO CHEMISTS MAKE PARTIAL REPORT AS TO POISONING OF KANSAS CITY MAN.

POISON IN NEPHEW'S LIVER

Officers and Representatives of the Swope Heirs Are Closely Guarding Report of the Chicago Chemists.

Kansas City, Mo., Jan. 29.—Poison has been found in the organs of the late Colonel Thomas H. Swope and his nephew, Christian Swope, and upon this finding the heirs of the dead millionaire will demand an investigation by the state to ascertain the cause of the death last fall of the two men.

The chemists, it is stated, found the poison in the livers, not in the stomachs. The exact conclusion reached so far by the Chicago chemists is being closely guarded. It is believed they are still pursuing the investigation.

Not Embalming Fluid.

Chicago, Ill., Jan. 29.—If traces of arsenic or strychnine were found in the organs of the late Colonel Swope and his nephew, Christian, they were not injected into the body and as a part of the embalming fluid. The manufacturers of the fluid stated today that they need neither of these poisons in compounding.

HOUSE REPUBLICANS ARRAIGN HASKELL

MINORITY ATTEMPTS TO MAKE POLITICAL PLAY BY CHARGES AGAINST HASKELL.

MISMANAGEMENT OF FUNDS

Lester A. Harris, Representing Republicans of House, Files Affidavit Against Haske, Smith, Hutchings, Anthony and Bellamy.

Guthrie, Okla., Jan. 29.—Charging Governor Haskell and other state officials with violation of the state constitution and the laws of the state in the manner in which the public moneys have been expended, Representative Lester A. Harris, representing the republican minority, filed affidavits in the lower house today.

In general the charges against the governor are that he mismanaged the public funds in his control, in whole or in part, and willfully and designedly authorized misappropriation of said funds.

The affidavits allege that O. T. Smith, the governor's law clerk, W. T. Hutchings, a Muskogee lawyer, W. B. Anthony, the governor's private secretary and Lieutenant Governor George W. Bellamy are also involved in the alleged improper expenditure.

WATERS OF SEINE ARE NOW RECEDING

WATERS BEGAN FALLING YESTERDAY MORNING AND CONTINUED ALL DAY.

Paris, Jan. 29.—The waters of the Seine, having reached an unprecedented height, causing great destruction, began to recede today.

The crest of the flood was reached at midnight, the waters remained stationary until 2 o'clock and then began falling slowly. This morning there had been a drop of two inches, according to the official statement issued this afternoon.
