Mrs. Ghornley Passes Away.

William Tompkins Will Filed.

Round-up Souvenir on Lustania Victim.

One of the victims of the submarine sunk steamship "Lustania" was wearing a Round-up souvenir watch fob, according to a letter received this morning by Hamley & Co., from officials of the Cunard Steamship Co. It was one of the pendants in the shape of the prize Round-up middle and was made by the Hamleys. The letter states that the body on which it was found was washed ashore at Loop Head July 17 and has not been identified. The name engraved on the watch was John Hancock. The body was buried at Kiltrilling graveyard. The Hamleys have no record of the thousands of souvenirs which they sold and consequently can throw no light on the identity of the body.
