MONTANA CATTLE AT PORTLAND

PORTLAND, March 8.—Four loads of Montana cattle arrived in the North Portland yards over night, being the first shipments from there for the local trade this season.

Condition of the cattle market in general is steady to firm. Stock is now getting so high priced that killers are no longer exceedingly anxious to take care of the extreme quality stuff, although there is by no means any weakness noted. The trade in that class of stuff is not quite so active.

It is the lower priced and poorer quality stuff that is selling best in the cattle division of the local trade.
