# TIPSY TAX FIGURES

It is always best to give saloon inspiration time to sober up. Thoughtful people were not disturbed at their loud talk about taxes because they expect loud talk from such sources.

Albany and Eugene have been held up as shining examples of increased taxes, while as a matter of fact the ratio of increase in taxes has been greater in Salem during the period of six years last past than either of the two cities.

We submit the following figures showing the levy as it appears upon the records of Marion county, of Lane county and of Lane county and let you draw from these figures your own conclusion. We list in separate columns under the head of Salem, Albany, and Eugene the levy as made for municipal or city purposes for the years 1907 to 1912, inclusive:

It will be noticed from these figures that in Albany, taxes increased in six years 6 mills. In Eugene in the same period and for the same years they increased 5 mills, while in Salem they increased, during the same period, 6.8 mills.

If the saloons are such a wonderful element as taxpayers, why is it that in Salem, a wet town, the taxes increased 1.6 mills more than they did in Eugene, a dry city, and .8 mills more than they did in Albany, a dry city, during exactly the same period of time? Will the Welfare League please answer?

# ANOTHER ARGUMENT EXPLODED

One of the arguments given by the Welfare League in favor of retaining saloons in the city of Salem is that in case they are voted out on this side, the saloon-keepers will move just across the river to West Salem, and will operate there and pay their license to West Salem, while the city of Salem will get the benefit of the drinks, and the inconvenience and notoriety of the same without receiving any benefit from the saloon license. They fail to tell you, when they make this argument, that the law prohibits the running of a saloon in any place except in an incorporated city or town, and they further fail to tell you

that the city of West Salem is about to vote upon a charter which must be passed and adopted before it will be a duly incorporated city. They fail to tell you that a clause in this charter forever prohibits the operation of saloons in West Salem. Don't be deceived by the threat that the saloons will move to the other side of the river. It is absolutely impossible for them to operate until the city is incorporated, and when incorporated, it will be just as impossible for them to operate, for the only charter which is before the people for adoption contains a stringent prohibition clause.
