North Bend—Buehner mill to be enlarged and add 60 hands.

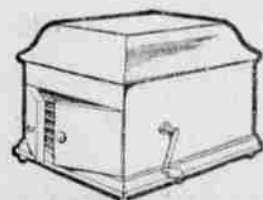
