LUMBER CUT ON COLUMBIA RIVER

Notwithstanding the fact that several of the mills in the lower Columbia river district were pressed into cutting a vast amount of spruce timber for aeroplane stock for the government during the year 1918, still in the past 12 months those mills shipped 246,820,880 feet of fir lumber in cargoes to markets of the world.

The great bulk of that lumber, or 227,775,243 feet went to California or other domestic points, while 19,065,647 feet were sent to foreign ports. As this lumber is worth an average of not less than \$12 per thousand feet, the shipments represent a market value of approximately \$2,961,849.56. The largest shipments were made in the month of August when 23,551,234 feet of lumber and lumber products were dispatched from the lower river district.

In the same 12 months the upper river mills shipped 61,730,169 feet in cargoes, making a grand total of 308,551,049 feet of lumber that left the Columbia river by water during the year of 1918. During the same period 443,725 bundles of box shooks were shipped, fully half of them going to the Hawaiian Islands.

SUMMER SCHOOL WILL BE 12 WEEKS LONG

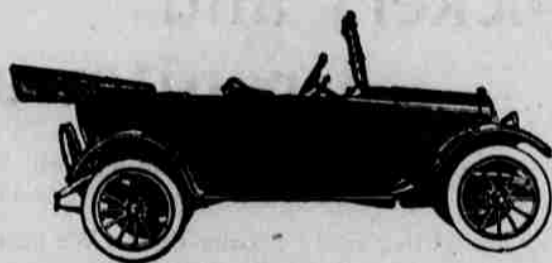
