

COURT PROCEEDINGS

Wednesday, April 2, 1919. 6th day. Court came pursuant to adjournment. Officers all present.

On this day the Clerk presents to Court his statement of scap fees issued during the month of March, as authorized, and being as follows:

March 22, 1919, Warrant No. 349 for \$17.70 in favor of Russell Makins.

March 25, 1919, Warrant No. 350, \$2.00 in favor of Arthur B. Hanna, and the Court being advised in the matter it is ordered that the said amount be and the same is hereby approved and accepted.

On this day there is presented to Court an order of the Judge of the Juvenile Court of the County of Columbia, State of Oregon, allowing pension in the amount of \$20 per month, in favor of Mary A. in accordance with Chapter General Laws of 1917, and the same being advised in the matter, ordered that the Clerk be and he is hereby authorized and instructed to issue a General Fund Warrant in the amount of \$17.50 in favor of Hanna, and a like warrant be issued on the first day of each month thereafter until the order of this Court.

On this day there is presented to Court an order of the County Court of the Juvenile Court of Col-
