**Understanding the Salvation Army What It Is and Why**

**WHAT IS THE SALVATION ARMY?**  
A religious body with two functions—evangelistic, which is primary, and social relief, made necessary by the evangelistic and giving per-  
manency to its most important results.  
Founded by the late General William Booth, London, 1865, first known as "The Christian Mission;" present name adopted 1878.  
Name derived from fact that the Army works for salvation of mankind, by the grace of God, from all forms of moral, spiritual and temporal  
distress. Form of government—military; tactics—militant and aggressive.

**BY WHAT LEGAL AUTHORITY DOES THE SALVATION ARMY EXIST IN THE UNITED STATES?**  
Act of legislature, State of New York: "An Act to Provide for the Incorporation of the Salvation Army," Chapter 468—became law  
April 28, 1899. Incorporated in California in 1915.

**IS THE SALVATION ARMY LEGALLY ENTITLED TO RECEIVE GIFTS AND BEQUESTS FOR CHARITABLE PURPOSES?**  
Yes. By section one of the act of incorporation.

**WHO ARE THE TRUSTEES?**  
The Commander, Chief Secretary and Treasurer of the Salvation Army in the United States, ex-officio, with two officers or two lay  
members selected by these three.
