

**SPRING TREE PLANTING**

More than fifteen hundred acres burned over land on the National Forest of Oregon and Washington will be replanted with trees this spring, according to an announcement by District Forester George H. Hill, Portland. This includes 540 acres of the Clispus burn, on the National Forest, and 174 acres of the Sleduck burn, near Lake Prescott, on the Olympic Forest, in Washington; 288 acres on the Breitenbach watershed of the Santiam National Forest, and 35 acres in the vicinity of the Crater Forest in Oregon.

With the exception of 40,000 yellow pine seedlings from Page Creek nursery, on the Siskiyou National Forest, which will be used on the Crater Peak area, all planting stock will come from the Wind River nursery, near Carson, Washington, on the Columbia National Forest, and consist chiefly of Douglas fir, western white pine, silver fir, and western white pine which will be used on the Steenshush project.

Planting of the more than a million baby trees to various planting sites began this week at the Wind River nursery.

**STUDY PLAN OF SELLING WHEAT**

Crusoe, Wash.—Farmers of the Crusoe district are taking a deep interest in the new wheat marketing plan of the Pacific Northwest Profit Cooperative Marketing Association and at an informal meeting of a number of influential farmers in this vicinity a committee was organized to examine into the details of the new plan and make a report. Farmers expect to examine the plan thoroughly in a businesslike manner and if it offers a cure for the evils of the past they expect to lend their aid to the movement.

Farmers are dissatisfied with the manner in which the wheat buy has been conducted. A large quantity of wheat was sold last year at the implied impression that it was to be sold at a profit.
