**Area of a Triangle.**  
Where the altitude and base of a triangle is known, the area of the triangle is found by multiplying one half of the base by the altitude. Where the lengths of the three sides of the triangle are known, the area of the triangle can be found by the following rule: From half the sum of the three sides subtract each side separately. Multiply together consecutively the half sum and the three remainders and extract the square root of the product which will be the area of the triangle.
