Circuit Court

Convened Monday With a Small Docket.

Circuit Court for the Eighth Judicial District for Wallowa County convened in Enterprise Monday morning, Judge Robert Eakin presiding. The following members of the bar were present: D. W. Sheahan, J. A. Burleigh, J. S. Cook, F. A. DePue, J. S. Hodgins, A. C. Smith and W. S. Burleigh, of Enterprise; H. G. Lake and S. Z. Henderson, of Joseph; O. M. Corkins, of Wallowa, and A. B. Winfree deputy District Attorney. C. H. Finn, of La Grande, arrived on Tuesday, as did also H. R. Hanna, the court stenographer. J. D. Slater, of La Grande, arrived on Wednesday.
