The Bonneville salmon hatchery, the biggest in the world, which will be the central fish hatchery for this state, was opened November 13th with appropriate exercises. Governor Benson, State Treasurer Steel, Fish Warden McAllister, of Oregon, and Fish Commissioner Riesland of Washington, together with a number of prominent cannerymen of both states, attended. The new hatchery is a model plant, and has a capacity of 60,000,000 eggs, there being now about 20,000,000 on hand. Nursery and feeding ponds are provided for 3,000,000 young fish.
