Evidence of the early operation of the salmon canneries along the Pacific Coast streams in this state is being manifested by the number of cannery licenses issued by Theodore Oppsand, clerk of the master fish warden's department.

Preparations are being made by the Harriman officials to receive Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth of Roumania, more generally known as Carmen Sylva, in state upon her arrival in Oregon towards the latter part of the month.

The Dalles has outgrown its water supply, and the water commission contemplates expending about \$35,000 this year in increasing the supply. It is proposed to build a large storage reservoir in the mountains 20 miles from the city.

John Leland Henderson of Hood River has announced his candidacy for the republican nomination for joint representative from Hood River and Wasco counties. He takes his stand as an ardent exponent of the direct primary law.
