Clackamas county has an indebtedness of \$122,000. It costs fully \$50,000 per year to run the county. Are the property owners of Toledo content to rest satisfied with the present conditions of her streets? The present condition is deplorable. There are no streets, no ways of ingress or egress for the traveling public. This must be remedied and that soon.

It is quite unlikely that the school fund will be apportioned before June, but as soon as the county superintendent is notified by the treasurer that the money is ready for apportionment there will not be any delay in forwarding notice of the same to the district clerks.

The May number of the Western Pedagogue comes to us in regular magazine form and replete with choice selections of educational gems. The Pedagogue is only \$1.00 per annum and is well worth ten times that much to every teacher. Subscriptions may be had at this office.

The last legislature employed 179 clerks at a total expense to the state of \$23,500. The total number of senators and representatives of the Oregon legislature is ninety. This makes nearly two clerks for each member of the legislature and made a clerical expense for each member of \$261.11. Must have been a "business" session in good truth.

A synopsis of the game laws of Oregon as made by an exchange are as follows: Book agents may be killed from June 1st to May 31st, inclusive; peddlers from January 1st to December 31st inclusive; canvassers, male, from April 1st to March 31st, female, from April 15 to April 14, inclusive; open season all year around on life insurance agents.

The last session laws are being now distributed to the parties in the state who are entitled to them. County Clerk Jones received three copies the first of the week. They comprise a voluminous volume, the greater portion of which is taken up with special laws for various localities. As soon as the books can be completed all the justices of the peace will be supplied with a copy.

The steamship Danube and captain are in a queer shape. The marine laws have been scandalously violated. She has on more passengers than allowed by law and the law will not let them be landed. This is a complicated case. More passengers than the law allows and the laws of the land won't allow them to get off. The Oregonian can explain if the court can't. Better throw them over board.

Deputy Game Warden C. W. Watts went to Corvallis last week and arrested Zeph Job, the well known banker on charge of violating the game law by building a dam across the river at Niagara, preventing fish from passing up the stream. J. R. Wyatt appeared for the state and J. K. Weatherfor and C. E. Wolverton for the defense. The complaint was demurred to on the grounds that it did not state sufficient facts to constitute a cause of action, and because the court did not have jurisdiction; but it was over ruled. Trial was set for May 31st at Albany. The case will be hotly contested and will be taken to the supreme court.
