VIOLIN MAKER IN SALEM

Famous Instruments Being Made These Days

Skillful Artist in This Line in Our Midst Makes Only the Stradivarius Kind

Salem now has in its midst a rare mechanic, an artisan—in reality an artist in his line. In the person of J. L. Coates, the violin maker and repairer. This an occupation that is not followed to any extent these days, but it is for that reason all the more interesting. We hear a great deal about the old masters, whose violins now sell at fabulous prices, but in this work like everything else modern progress is being applied.

Mr. Coates is originally from Chicago, but with his wife, who is in poor health, is traveling about the West looking for relief and he at the same time follows his calling. He says there is plenty to do everywhere and is busy all the time, either repairing, rebuilding or making new violins. He is devoted to his work, and his instruments are being classed among the best turned out at the present time. He makes no instrument under \$100, and some that he has made could not be bought today for \$1000.

Mr. Coates says there are a few first-class makers in this country now, and that there are now being as good instruments made as were ever turned out. Even the famous Stradivarius are being excelled in some respects and it would not be surprising if the present century puts into the shade all the old masters in this line of work.

Among other things Mr. Coates makes a specialty of re-grading old violins, and by this process, which is that of taking apart and finishing the inside, he makes some first-class instruments even out of machine made fiddles. He has all manner of tools for testing the wood, callipers for taking the thickness of all parts of a violin, and all manner of contrivances and tools for shaving, polishing and fitting the delicate pieces of wood, all of which is necessary to produce a perfect instrument. He can take an old instrument apart and by going over the different parts give it an entirely new tone.

Mr. Coates has work sent him from all parts of the United States, and carries with him materials and wood of all kinds pertaining to his business. He has some violin backs with him cut from hard maple slabs nearly 50 years old. Some of these backs are a solid piece, but most of them are glued in the center. He has some of these pieces that seem as hard as flint which he has carried with him over twenty years, and although they contain less than two feet of rough lumber, he values them at not less than ten dollars. The fronts of all violins are made of spruce, and Mr. Coates considers the Oregon grown spruce as fine as there is in the world, although our maple is too soft for the backs.

Any person interested in the manufacture of violins or who takes a general interest in a rare mechanic, a man who devotes his whole existence to his work—who works for the work's sake—ought to call at Prof. Coates' workshop up stairs in the Murphy block. He will be here several months, and makes it very interesting for callers. An Olympia paper, where Mr. Coates was before coming to Oregon, has the following item of interest concerning his movements: "J. L. Coates, the well-known violin maker, will leave today for Salem where he will make his home for a year or so at least. Salem offers a better field for his handwork, although as a place of residence Mr. Coates believes he prefers Olympia. As a violin maker Mr. Coates' name is not confined to this section and some of his best instruments are in the hands of famous violinists. He
