

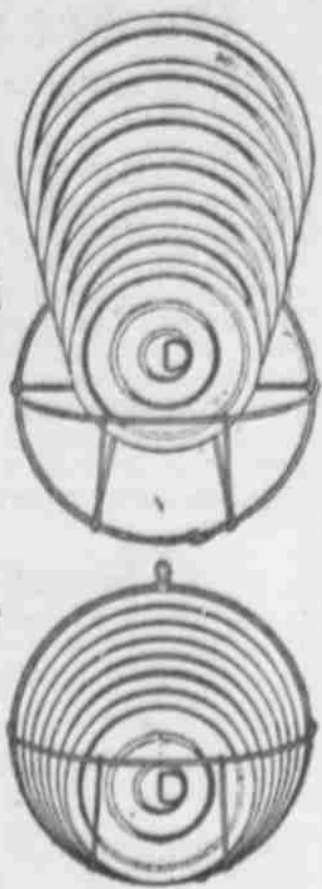

## ENLARGED ELECTRIC PLANT

Fifty Thousand Dollars to Be Spent at Salem

In Enlarging the Power Station and Reconstruction and Extension of the Lines

The property known as the lighting and power plant of the Capital City is one of the largest public service concerns in the state. It supplies electric power and gas for heating purposes to the people of the Capital City, and to the city, county and state institutions. The local plant, in addition, furnishes power to an extensive street car system. All of this property has gone under the management of a new ownership, at the head of which stands H. W. Goode, as president. He is one of the most prominent capitalists in the state, and has to his credit the successful management of the Lewis and Clark fair. He is also president of the Portland General Electric Company, and has now become president of the Citizens' Light & Traction Company of Salem.

F. G. Sykes is the new vice-president, and S. G. Reed is secretary and treasurer, both of Portland.

The new manager at Salem of these properties is Hollis K. Page, a well-known and popular Oregon lawyer, son of Judge W. W. Page. He has for a number of years been prominent as manager of the Union Light & Power Company, at Silverton, which has been purchased by the present owners of the Citizens' Light & Traction Company, which remains the owner and holder of that valuable water power at Silverton, which furnishes light and power to a number of citizens in Marion county. Mr. Page has taken charge of the Citizens' Light & Traction Company's office at Salem, where he will be glad to meet and talk with the patrons of the company at all times. His office door swings wide open, and there is nothing unfriendly or un-democratic about the new manager. There have been no changes so far in the personnel of the working force, except some of the office people who preferred to continue in the employ of Messrs. A. and Russell Welch, who have no further connection with the Salem properties. W. B. Montague, formerly of Albany, remains the head man in the office. He is popular with Salem people, and liked by the employees generally.

It can be stated in behalf of the new ownership of the Citizens' Light & Traction Company that they have not purchased the property for speculation. Their investment is for business reasons, and the Salem plants may be regarded as having passed into final ownership, whose business it is to make electric current, and furnish it to customers at reasonable prices, that will make the business profitable to all parties concerned. To a reporter of The Journal Mr. Page stated that he was making a careful investigation of all the conditions, becoming familiar with every detail of the present plant and the service that was being rendered the people. He said their only ambition was to give a first-class service, alike and the same to all. He said he had proceeded far enough to realize, that the first necessity was to build up the power end of the plant. The service conditions would be looked after and perfected next. There will have to be a great deal of line reconstruction, as soon as the season is right for that kind of work. Line work and extensions will cost \$25,000. The corporation will expend another \$25,000 on increasing the power plant. First, they will install 600 additional horse power and electric capacity at the Salem power station. They will add 250 additional horsepower boiler capacity, and ability to create and transmit 1100 horsepower electric capacity. Plans are perfected for transmitting 60,000 volts from Oregon City for the Willamette Valley Traction Company. This power line will be used to furnish light and power at all the towns along the line.

If all these improvements materialize the people of Salem will have no reason to complain over the change in ownership of these valuable properties at the Capital City. A great deal of labor will be given employment. Permanent improvements will be made. A great deal of capital will be expended. A popular management that will try to meet the needs and demands of the largest number of people will be guaranteed. The character of the men at the head of these properties is such that the people need have no fear of their ability or disposition to make good the promises held out to the community.

## SALEM CHECK ARTIST

Takes a Post Graduate Course at Albany

Albany Herald, March 23d.  
A warrant is out for the arrest of Stephen F. Hartgrove, a young man who spent the past few weeks in this city, charging him with obtaining money under false pretenses. Hartgrove, who served for the last two weeks as night clerk in the St. Charles hotel, is accused of passing several bad checks on business men in the city. The checks were drawn on the First National bank, were signed with his name and were for comparatively small amounts. One was paid to W. B. Stevens & Co. for \$16.95, another was passed on Fosby & Mason for \$10 and a third on E. C. Churchill for \$6. The checks were issued on Wednesday evening, and a part of the proceeds were taken in trade. When the checks were presented at the bank yesterday forenoon it was soon found that they were worthless, and that Hartgrove had never had an account there.

Hartgrove tried to get the checks cashed at other stores in the city on Wednesday evening, but failed. The young man did not leave the city until yesterday morning, going, it is supposed, by the Lebanon train to Tallman, where he took the train on the Springfield branch for Woodburn. Hartgrove came here from Salem several weeks ago and was planning to return there, claiming to have an engagement in a vaudeville theater there. While here he conducted himself in an orderly manner, and no one knowing him thought for an instant that he was a bad check artist.

It is thought the fellow will not go far before he will be arrested, as his description has been telegraphed in every direction. If arrested a term in the penitentiary will probably be his fate.

## SHEEP VERSUS CATTLE

Governor Chamberlain has sent a communication to President Roosevelt relative to the recent troubles which have arisen in Umatilla county between the Oregon sheepmen and the Washington stockmen over the grazing privileges in the Wenaha forest reserve.

The feeling is becoming acute, and the Umatilla County Wool Growers' Association recently sent a report to the governor asking him to give their case special attention. It seems that Oregon sheepmen have been discriminated against in favor of the Washington sheepmen in the use of the reserve as grazing land.

It is also alleged that the chief ranger of the service and the forester of the state of Washington, for that district, are personally interested in this controversy between the citizens of Oregon and those of Washington. The chief executive, in his letter, says: "I earnestly beseech that you require a complete investigation to be made as to the trouble growing out of the use of Wenaha reserve, to the end that an equitable adjustment thereof may be had, and destruction of life and property avoided. Both these contingencies are likely to happen unless something can be done to make the people living in the section where these troubles exist feel that they are being fairly treated."
