Blood-money and Shipping Sailors

The abuses connected with the shipping of sailors have been a topic of comment in various papers for a long time. The New York Maritime Register, the San Francisco Bulletin and other influential journals have discussed the question, and the matter has been brought to the attention of Congress.

A bill was introduced in the lower house of congress in February last, by Mr. Chandler of Massachusetts, which was read twice, printed and referred to the committee on commerce. The title is, "a bill for the relief and improvement of seamen in the merchant service by changing the system of advance wages." It provides among other things, that after the first day of November of the present year, any document authorizing the future payment of money on account of any seaman's wages, conditioned on his going to sea from any port in the United States, before the wages are earned, shall be void.

In short, the bill strikes directly at all advances to seamen, which have been the fruitful source of corruption and shameful frauds. No money paid in satisfaction of any document purporting to be for advances shall ever be deducted from seaman's wages. No bounty or blood-money shall ever be deducted from his wages, even though the sailor may have signed a receipt for the same. Clothing sold at sea may be deducted from wages earned or unearned. But no clothing shall be sold at a larger profit in such instances than 25 per cent. on the original cost, as shown by the invoice sworn to and signed by the master. In this way destitute sailors going to sea will be furnished with outfits suitable for them. But sailors well provided on shipping will not, of course, be obliged to purchase anything of the masters. Every seaman, whether shipping at Atlantic or Pacific ports, for deep water voyages and for coast voyages, except when the destination is less than four hundred miles, must produce a certificate made within three months by some authorized surgeon. Any objection on the part of the seaman shall work a forfeiture of one-quarter of his wages to the United States hospital fund. And any master receiving a seaman without a certificate shall pay a fine to the collector of the first port of entry of \$10, to be added to the marine hospital fund.

There is an important omission in the fourth section, the substance of which is given above. A surgeon's certificate must be provided, but there is not a word as to the kind of certificate. Suppose the seaman is unwell, and the certificate states as such, would that comply with the law? The fifth section provides that if any sailor going on board of a vessel on a verbal agreement to go on the voyage, shall refuse to sign the articles and proceed, the Master of said vessel may take him before any United States commissioner or justice of the peace, and if it shall appear that the seaman is not justified in his refusal, the Judge may order him put on board, and may sign the articles for him, and the entire expense of the proceedings may be deducted out of his wages. But if the seaman is justified in his refusal, the Master shall pay him \$1 a day and board while he has been detained on the ship. Every master is required to keep a separate account with each seaman, and twenty-four hours before the final discharge shall render an itemized account, and this account must be signed by both parties or their authorized attorneys. Seaman's wages are to run until the account is paid in full. The eighth section provides that all masters shall have the right to ship and pay off the men in their employ.

This is the essence of the bill now before Congress. Its provisions are humane and just, and strike directly at abuses which have long existed at all the great shipping ports of the country. That these abuses and friends have not been exaggerated is clear from evidence not only within reach, but from a distance. The New York Maritime Register has an article headed "Abettors in the Blood-Money Business." It declares that sailors are sold in that part like cattle. "A seaman can no more obtain a berth on a ship without the consent of his owner—the boarding-house keeper—than he can secure the command of a sloop-of-war. The boarding-house man secures the ship, orders the sailor to sign the articles, and then, for the 'chance,' charges him a good round commission, taken out of the advance wages."

The bill should receive the sanction of congress, and when it is the law of the land should be strictly enforced.
