Ordinance No. 1048 as Amended.

An ordinance regulating and prohibiting animals from running at large within the limits of the city of Astoria: The City of Astoria does ordain as follows:

Section 1. No horses, mules, cattle, sheep, swine, or goats, shall be allowed to run at large or be herded in any of the streets, alleys, parks, or public places in the City of Astoria during any of the hours of the day or night, except when being driven through for shipment or other purposes as hereinafter provided, unless the owner or owners of such animal or animals shall first obtain permission of the owner or agent of the premises on which or in front of which it is proposed to feed such animal, and then and in that case such animal must be securely fastened with a rope in the hands of some person, sufficiently able to manage and control such animal.

Section 2. Any of the animals described in section 1 of this ordinance found running at large within the limits of the city, except as provided in sections 1, 2 and 3, may be taken up by any police officer or by any person and impounded in a pound or enclosure to be provided therefor; and such animal shall be provided with proper care, food and water while so confined.

Section 3. The Chief of Police shall give immediate notice by posting written or printed notices in three public places within said city describing such animal, and stating that if the owner does not appear and pay costs and charges of the seizure and keeping such animal, within three days from the date of the notice; that if such animal will be sold at public auction at a time and place to be specified in the notice, which notice must be dated the date of posting the same.

Section 4. The owner or owners of any animal or animals so impounded may appear at any time after the seizure and upon paying the costs and expenses of keeping such animal, to wit: the sum of one dollar per day while so impounded, and a further sum of one dollar as a fee for impounding the animal, shall be entitled to receive such animal, and all sums so paid shall go to the Chief of Police, or such person as he may authorize to impose this ordinance as hereinafter provided.

Section 5. The Chief of Police may, by writing appoint a person to seize, take possession of and keep, as herein provided, all animals found running at large within the limits of the city, and such appointment, when made, shall be filed in the office of the Auditor and Police Judge of said city.

Section 6. If at the expiration of the notice, provided for in section three of this ordinance, no person has appeared and paid the costs, charges and fee for impounding such animal, it shall be the duty of the Chief of Police to proceed and sell such animal, at the time and place in such notice specified, at public auction to the highest bidder for cash, and retain from the proceeds of such sale the amount of said costs, expenses and fees, and the overplus, if any there be, shall be paid into the city treasury, and the Common Council, upon receiving satisfactory evidence of ownership of such animal or animals, shall order a warrant to be drawn upon the treasury for such overplus in favor of such owner.

Section 7. When any animal is impounded under this ordinance, if the owner or owners thereof be known, a copy of the posted notice shall be personally served upon such owner or owners if he reside within the limits of said city, but if such owner reside outside the city limits he may be served by mail.

Section 8. Whenever any animal is sold under this ordinance the Chief of Police shall make a report showing his proceedings in full in relation to the matter, which report shall be filed in the office of the City Auditor and Police Judge.

Section 9. The sale of an animal under the provisions of this ordinance shall operate to convey unto the purchaser a full, absolute and complete title to such animal.

Section 10. It shall be unlawful for the owner of any animal to permit the same to wear a bell within the city limits; and the owner of such animal, upon conviction thereof in Police Court, shall be fined not to exceed one hundred dollars, or by imprisonment not to exceed twenty days, or both, in the discretion of the Auditor and Police Judge.

Section 11. That ordinance No. 405, entitled "To prevent animals from running at large within certain limits within the City of Astoria," approved March 23rd, 1881, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Section 12. It shall be the duty of the Chief of Police and each Policeman and Captain of Police to enforce the provisions of this ordinance, and any officer knowingly failing so to do shall be liable to removal for such neglect.

Section 13. No person or persons shall hinder, interfere with or molest any person or persons who may be engaged in enforcing the provisions of this ordinance, and any person, upon conviction thereof in Police Court, shall be fined not less than five nor more than fifty dollars, or by imprisonment not to exceed twenty days, or both in the discretion of the Court.

What to do With Light Weight Coins.

"Light weight gold coins," said an assistant United States treasurer, "can be sold for their weight in gold, the same as bullion. It is our duty to stamp the word 'light' on all gold coins below weight that come to our hands. A certain St. Louis bank once brought \$100,000 in gold coin to the sub-treasury, and \$3,200 of it proved to be light, and was so marked by us. Light gold coin is not redeemable for its face value, but the case is different with silver. We give full-sized silver coins in even exchange for silver coins that are worn smooth, but in no case do we redeem coins that are defaced or mutilated. The smooth silver coins we send out to be re-coined. Sometimes we receive light gold coins in the remittances to the treasury of the country postmasters. In all such circumstances we stamp the light gold and return it to the senders. Some time ago the government officers came to the conclusion that acids were used that reduced the size of gold coins, making the pieces look as they had been gradually worn by handling, and that is one of the principal reasons why smooth gold coins are not redeemed for their coin-face value."
