



## ANOTHER ATLANTIC SQUADRON

(United Press Leased Wire.)

Washington, Dec. 14.—America's front door will be guarded when Rear-Admiral Evans' fleet sails to look over the situation in the back yard. By the first of the year the first division of the new fleet will be under tentative formation, and it will be known as the third squadron of the Atlantic fleet.

At the head of this fleet will be the Mississippi, under command of Captain John C. Fremont. This battleship will be joined by the Idaho, her sister ship, and the battleships Indiana and New Hampshire. These will be under command of Admiral Glover. The second division will be composed of renovated protected cruisers, with the Minneapolis as the flagship. It is known that the Columbia, Tacoma and Des Moines will be part of the second division.

A special division will be formed in the spring, and later on the monster armored cruisers North Carolina and Montana and other ships now being modernized will form another division.

### Ketchal May Meet Sullivan.

San Francisco, Dec. 14.—Stanley Ketchal, winner of Thursday night's fight, will not talk shop for a few days. He planned all along, in case he should win, to pay a visit to his parents in Grand Rapids, Mich., and will leave shortly.
