## HORSES AND MEN AT THE FAIR

Two express cars containing some of the fastest horses ever entered at the local race course at the fair grounds, arrived Tuesday afternoon, and were placed in the new barns just built this season for the predicted overflow of racers to enter the coming week, and the board's foresight proved most valuable, owing to the fact entries will probably be turned away before Monday for want of more space.

The shipments arriving Tuesday from the different courses in California contains stock which will be entered both in the large and small stake affairs. For the 2:14 trotting there will be Bertha Mac, with a record of 2:08; Richie Barehand with a 2:04 1/4 mark; Em'lie W., mark 2:10 Valio Girl, mark 2:10 1/4; Della Darby, mark 2:17; Nogie, 2:09 1/4 mark; Easter Bells, with a mark of 2:11 1/4.

Those from the south to enter in the 2:08 pace stake are: Dellah, mark 2:07 1/4, an exceptionally fast little animal which raced the southern sprint in fipa style, Charley D., mark 2:06 1/4; Salina Boy, without mark; John R. Conway, 2:07 1/2 record and Miss Idaho with a mark of 2:09 flat.

In the 2:20 pace there will enter: Thomas Murphy, a horse with a fine reputation, and Josephine, mark 2:20 1/2.

In the 2:12 trot three of the Californians will try for the wire, they being: R. Ambuch, mark 2:09; Atbersham, 2:10 1/4 mark; Bertha Mac will be a doubtful starter.

In the 2:20 trot, Monocrat, Elsan-dre, mark 2:12 1/4.

Those representing the south in the largest event of the week, the 2:05 pace will be: Mona Wilkes, mark 2:03 1/4; Lelan Onward, mark 2:04 and Zoloe, a horse well known to the Salem fans with a mark of 2:05 1/4.

This race has prospects of beating some of the previous records made on the Pacific coast, as all the horses above mentioned and others, which will be in the try-out, are in the best of condition.

Among the well known trainers and managers heretofore having racing stock under supervision here are: Dan Donahue, John Young, Mitchell Thomas, "Speak" Robinson who drove the prominent horse "Jay H. Kay" throughout the East, Buck Palmer, Patsey Davey, Eddy Grancy, James Tierney, Henry Delancy, and Homer Rutherford and F. H. Burk.

### WEATHER REPORT

General Summary.

The week on the whole was very favorable. The mean temperature was slightly above normal, with the seasonal characteristics of warm days and cool nights. The nights were sufficiently cool to cause frost in the plateau counties on a few mornings, but no damage of consequence resulted therefrom. The 3d and 4th were the warmest days at which the maximum temperature of 90 degrees or more were common in the eastern counties to the east of the Coast range of mountains. The last two days of the week were showery, but the rainfall was light in all districts. The sunshine was abundant, and no damaging winds were reported.

**Coast District.**  
Newport, Lincoln county, Jno. E. Matthews—The weather was fine and warm during the past week.

**Willamette Valley.**  
Portland, Multnomah county, Local Office, Weather Bureau—The week was generally clear and warm until Saturday, when it clouded up and continued cloudy and cool till the close of the week. Light rain fell Sunday.

**Bull Run, Clackamas county, Portland Water Works**—The week was clear and warm until Saturday, when weather set in. No rain fell.

**Salem, Marion county, M. P. Baldwin**—The week was clear and warm with no rain.

**Albany, Linn county, F. M. French**—There was no rain during the week. The temperature was normal.

**Corvallis, Benton county, E. P. Erwin**—The week was clear and pleasant, except Saturday, which was cooler, with cloudy weather. No rain fell.

**Columbia River Valley.**  
Cascade Locks, Hood River county Val. W. Tomkin—The week was warm and clear, with light westerly winds, changing to cooler and cloudy on Sunday.

**Condon, Gilliam county, S. C. Dodson**—The first part of the week was cool, but it was quite warm during the latter part. Westerly winds prevailed. No rain fell.

**Mikallo, Gilliam county, J. T. Chandler**—Clear skies, with gradually rising temperature, characterized the week. Light to brisk westerly winds prevailed. No rain fell.

**Heppner, Morrow county, George Whites**—The week has been unseasonably warm during the daytime, with cool nights. No rain fell.

**Hermiston, Umatilla county, H. F. Johnson**—The winds were mainly from the north. The day temperatures were warm, reaching 95 on two days. No rain fell, and there was but little cloudiness.

**Plateau District.**  
Prineville, Crook county, C. I. Wennek—The weather was dry, with cool nights and warm days.

**Chf., Lake county, John C. Green**—The fore part of the week was cool the last four days have been warmer. No rain fell.

**Vale, Malheur county, H. P. Osborn**—The week was characterized by hot days and cool nights. Frost occurred Tue-day night. There was no precipitation.
