TRIED TO DITCH TRAIN AND LANDED IN JAIL

[United Press Leased Wire]. San Francisco, June 17.—Auctioneers are planning to rush enormous consignments of tea from the Orient before July 1, the date when the new tariff bill probably will go into effect. With the exception of the Spanish-American war period there never has been a tax on tea and the larger importers are much concerned as to the probable effect of such an excise upon the retail trade.

So determined are many of the local and eastern firms to lay in a large warehouse stock of tea that many rush orders have been cabled to the Orient within the last week. The liner Asia, carrying 1,000 tons of tea, will not touch at Honolulu, a regular port of call, but will proceed directly to this port in a race against time. If she succeeds in docking before the tariff becomes operative, thousands of dollars will be saved to the Carter-Machy Company of New York, to whom her cargo is consigned.
