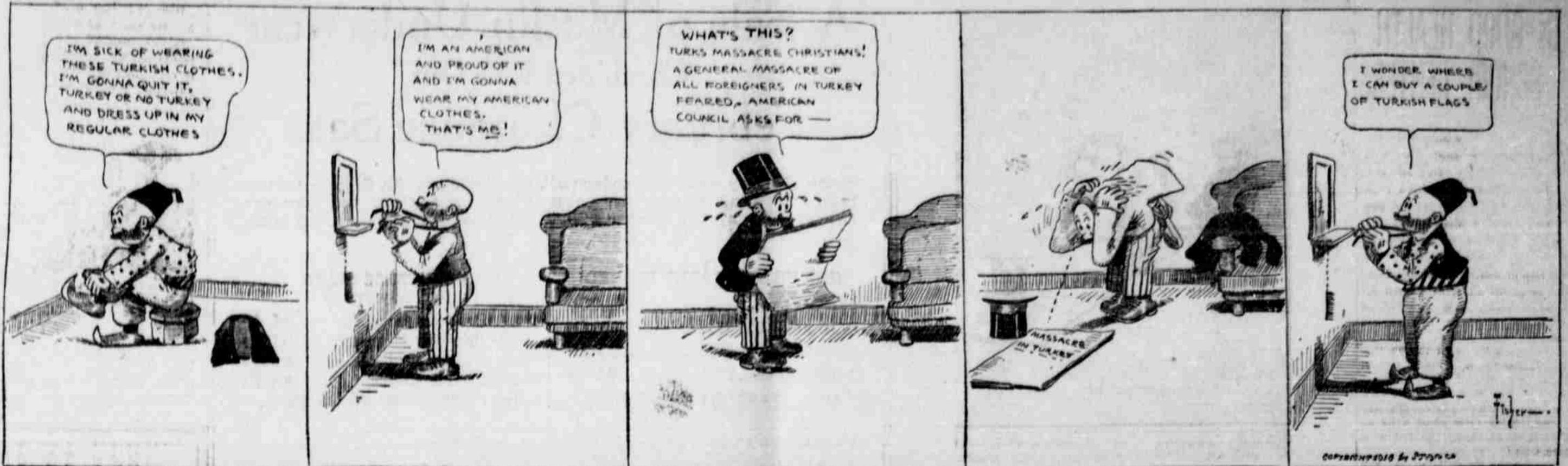

APPLE TRADE HURT BY OPEN WINTER NEW YORK CITY

Sgobel & Day report as follows under date of New York January 31: The apple situation stands today as follows: Liverpool—L. Connolly & Co. arrivals Watsonville Newtowns fresh arrivals, 6s 3d and 4 1/2 tier 5s 3d to 5s 6d, adding no demand whatever for those stored in Liverpool. They give no quotations on Oregon Newtowns. London—M. Isaacs & Sons cable Watsonville Newtowns, good stock, 5s 6d to 6s 6d, but selling slowly, inferior selling 4s 6d to 5s, and Oregon Newtowns 8s to 10s. Exports last week were: London, 19,800; Hamburg, 13,600; Bremen, 3,100; Glasgow, 3,200; Hull, 1,200; total, 41,000. No steamer sailed for London last week. This market continues in bad shape. DISSOLUTION OF SHOE TRUST

DETROIT, Mich., Feb. 6.—Dissolution of the "Shoe Last Trust" was effected here today when eighteen firms and a score of individuals accepted the final decree of the United States district court which ordered modification of their business methods. The government alleged the trust dominated the prices of shoe lasts of all descriptions, both patented and unpatented, through license agreements.
