BOMBAY, March 4 .- With Impos ing tribal ceremonies 800 native children of ages varying from ten years to 12 years have just been married at Surat, India. Early marriages are common in the East, but the Lewa Kunbi sect only celebrate weddings every ten years, so practically every child over one year was rounded up and duly married off. Not one of the brides was over 12, and the majority were between one and seven years of age, while the bridegrooms varied from three to nine. Most of the "happy couples" had to be nursed by their parents during the ceremony, and sucked candies in blissful ignorance of their fate.
