APPLE PRICES IN EASTERN MARKETS

Scobell & Day issue the following, dated New York, Feb. 28: Today's markets abroad show as follows: Liverpool—L. Connelly & Co. report market unchanged. Watsonville 4-tier, 6s. 9d.; 4 1/2-tier, 5d.; Oregon, 4 1/2-tier, 7s to 7s. 6d. London—M. Isaacs & Sons cable a little better state of things. Watsonville 4-tier, 6s. 3d to 6s. 6d.; 4 1/2-tier, 5s. 6d.; Oregon Newtowns, 7s to 9s. From four to eight cars of apples are lightered over to the Erie wharf daily. Almost all of them are sold at private sale, the best red apples, \$1.25 to \$1.75, lower grades or poorer quality, 80c to \$1.75. Some good Hood River Newtowns, extra fancy, sold \$1.25 to \$1.75. Some Wenatche Spitzburgs, few of the very large sizes, \$1.35, bulk of the more desirable sizes, \$1.75. At auction the only offerings, virtually, are those made by the North American Fruit Exchange and one other party here who has a car of apples a day coming from Spokane. Auction sales this week were as follows: Monday—Washington Wagners, \$1.25 to \$1.30; Washington Jonathans, \$1.10 to \$1.20. Tuesday—Wenatche Spitzburgs, \$1.75 to \$1.85; Wenatche Staymon Winesaps, \$1.25 to \$1.45; Washington Wagners, \$1.10 to \$1.20; Washington Jonathans, 90c to \$1.00. Wednesday—Washington Wagners, \$1.20; Washington Ben Davis, 84c. We had hoped that the small arrivals of Navels from California here and the corresponding jump in prices of Florida and Porto Rico oranges would have helped boost apples and they may after a little while, but surely have not as yet.

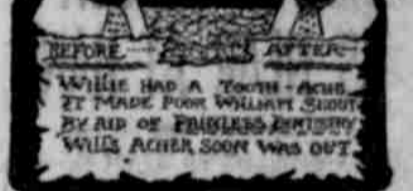
