ORDINANCE NO. 736.

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE TYING OR CHECKING HORSES IN THE STREET. The City of Medford doth ordain as follows: Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to leave standing in the streets of Medford any horse or team, unless the same is hitched to or tied to rack or post, or fastened to a weight attached to a strap or chain and to the bridle or halter, or fastened to the wagon or vehicle, check or snags so that the said vehicle cannot be moved except with the lines so fastened.
