

TELL ADVANTAGE OF OREGON MADE PRODUCTS TONIGHT

The inauguration of a state campaign by the Oregon Manufacturers Association is meeting with the hearty co-operation of every patriotic citizen. Realizing that factories are one of Oregon's greatest needs, a systematic plan for this end is being installed in every county in Oregon.

Mrs. Edyth Tozier Weathered who has charge of woman's department for this work, has arrived in Medford to remain a week. She will speak at the public library tonight under the auspices of the Medford Commercial club and the Greater Medford club, in behalf of home industries and their patronage.

Mrs. Weathered is a native daughter of Oregon, a prominent club woman, and a journalist. She has been a commissioner from this state to several international expositions. "Being familiar with the social and industrial conditions of Oregon makes my work both easy and interesting," said Mrs. Weathered. "The more I travel over Oregon, the greater grows my enthusiasm for a bigger handling of dairy products and several others particularly adapted to these valleys of Western Oregon. Prosperity is the goal to which we are all striving—and a patronage of our home industries maintains those already established and encourages new ones. Payroll—that is the best asset any community can have. The large pioneer donation claims are fast being transformed into small tracts. There is more concentration and not so many diversified interests as formerly and this is making a way for factories, such as fruit canneries. The producer is also a consumer, and not only this, but plenty of markets elsewhere. Your valley here has only been scratched and its great future is assured if every patriotic citizen will work to that end. Why wait your year after year for others to establish industries. And why not buy the thing already made in your county and state. To stimulate this sentiment is my mission and the manufacturers, association of Oregon is backing me in the greatest missionary work yet inaugurated in the state."

These statements and many others were made by Mrs. Weathered, who has made study of every line of Oregon industry problems. She will remain here several days. Her public address will be given this evening at the library. She will also visit the stores and learn what is mostly sold that is made in Oregon. She will give special attention to the commodities manufactured in Jackson county and strive to educate the women to ask for these products of their merchants. Mrs. Weathered declares that the Oregon goods must be dependable and meet with the desired standard, or the people will not be expected to patronize. Mrs. Weathered asks no local financial assistance in her work, all expenses being met by the Oregon Manufacturers' association. She earnestly calls for co-operation of the citizens of Jackson county.

RIVALRY OVER LEPER STATION

SEATTLE, Wn., Mar. 25.—Rivalry between Pacific Coast states for federal appropriations reached the limit today when it was announced here, that an attempt would be made to wrest from California a leper colony, which the government had been asked to build on San Miguel Island, off the Southern California coast. Surgeon General Rupert Blue has been asked to establish the refuge for victims of this dread disease on Puget Sound.

According to Representative Albert Johnson, Surgeon Earle, of the quarantine station at Port Townsend has recommended that it be placed on Protection Island, near Discovery Bay. Port Townsend citizens who want the three lepers now at the temporary detention colony on Diamond Head removed from that place have endorsed the Protection Island plan. It is claimed that the island off the Southern California coast has an insufficient water supply. This is denied in reports received here from Representative Lafferty of Oregon, and Health Officer E. O. Sawyer of Los Angeles, who favor the California location. Lafferty has a bill for the San Miguel station which he will present before the next congress.

THREATS SHATTER NERVE AND POLICEMAN RESIGNS

PORT TOWNSEND, Wash., March 25.—Threatened with death over the telephone so often that his nerves became shattered, Policeman Thomas Ezell has resigned and left the city. Ezell is the officer who shot and killed Private Claud Tallman, of the Coast Artillery at Fort Worden during a street fight last Wednesday morning. His fellow artillerymen announced that they would "get" Ezell, and the latter feared they would make good the threat.

CALENDAR OF CRIMINAL AND CIVIL CASES BIG

The March term of the Circuit court opened at Jacksonville today. Judge F. M. Calkins presiding. A large amount of criminal and civil work is to be disposed of.

The first business to come before the court was the selection of a grand jury. The following men were chosen: W. M. Petri, Joseph Mayfield, J. C. Calvert, Geo. W. Dean, Frank Schuette, J. T. Dodge, Frank Nichol. The grand jury immediately adjourned until October 20. They are subject to a call of the court however.

Among the first cases to be called in the circuit court will be the indictments against the Medford saloonmen.

WHERE ONE OF THE MOST DARING OF ROBBERIES TOOK PLACE

In the twenty-four hours between six o'clock March 15 and the same hour March 16 burglars bored their way, by a devious but careful route, into the big vault in the pawnbroking offices of Martin Simons & Son, New York city, and are credited with obtaining richer booty than thieves have netted in any similar crime in many years.

It has been estimated that the robbers obtained at least \$250,000 worth of diamonds and diamond jewelry, \$3,000 in cash and \$2,400 in checks. The vault is said to have contained \$800,000 in valuables when it was locked. Of this, it is said, \$600,000 represented jewelry upon which money had been loaned and which was held as pledges for those loans. Besides the cash and checks taken by the thieves the vault also contained \$130,000 in negotiable bonds and \$50,000 in notes.

The robbers, by entering the basement, tunneled their way into the pawnshop from an adjoining building. Removing the cement floor and boring holes through the partitions, the robbers finally succeeded in making an opening in the great safe. Fifty detectives are now at work on the case.

ESPEE TO KEEP CENTRAL PACIFIC

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., March 25.—Retention by the Southern Pacific of its interests in the Central Pacific and the Associated Oil company is made possible under the new plan to effect the dissolution of the Harriman merger, according to William Spruoley president of the Southern Pacific who is here today.

Spruoley declared that the Union Pacific is working out a separate plan to divorce itself from the Harriman merger. This will involve the sale of a big block of Southern Pacific stock now in the coffers of the Union Pacific.

Under the new plan the Union Pacific may continue to route its Pacific Coast business over the Southern Pacific tracks out of Ogden.

GRAND JURY RETURNS TWENTY-FIVE TRUE BILLS

The grand jury which completed its work last Saturday investigated 23 matters and examined 76 witnesses at the last term. They returned 25 true bills and five not true bills. They were impaneled December, and were adjourned by the court until October 20, subject to the call of the court.

The circuit court began its hearing of the cases Monday, the day being occupied in legal formalities incidental to the opening of a new term of court. The Medford saloon men indicted for selling liquor to minors were arraigned, and will appear Wednesday. They are represented by Attorney A. E. Reames with Judge Holbrook Withington, associate.

SALOONMEN WILL PLEAD WEDNESDAY

The ten local saloonmen indicted Saturday by the grand jury for selling liquor to minors appeared in the circuit court Monday afternoon and were arraigned. They will enter their pleas on Wednesday morning.

Monday's session was very short. The indictments were read to the indicted men and the court then gave them until Wednesday morning to plead. As soon as the pleas are entered the cases will be set down for trial.

The first criminal case to be called in the circuit court at this term will be the state vs. Frank Kelley, the "methodical" burglar, who confessed to entering and robbing a large number of business houses.
