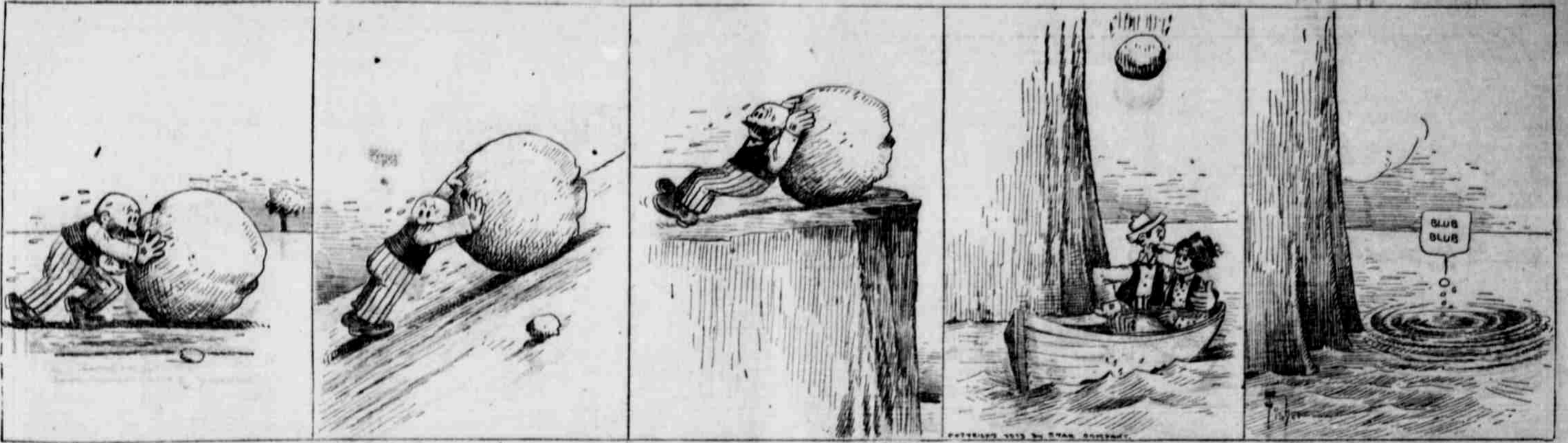

PARCEL POST SHOWS 50 PERCENT INCREASE

WASHINGTON, April 5.—An increase of fifty per cent in the number of parcel post packages handled in March over January is shown in a report of parcel post business for the first three months of this year, issued today by Postmaster General Burleson. More than 50,000,000 packages were handled during the three months. Chicago, with 6,000,000 packages handled, led all the cities, with New York second and Boston third.

NEGRO SLAYER OF MONTANA SHERIFF LYNCHED BY MOB

MONDOK, Mont., April 4.—J. W. Collins, the negro slayer of Sheriff Courtney was taken from jail at ten o'clock and lynched by a frenzied mob of Mondok people stringing him up to a telephone pole and then setting fire to his clothes in a vain effort to cremate the body after riddling the swaying corpse with bullets. Burgmeister died tonight in a local hospital. Collins yesterday beat up another negro named Patterson. A crowd of people took up the chase and when the negro saw no chance of escape he surrendered.

RESOLUTION

ORDINANCE NO. 737.
An ordinance providing for the construction of an 8 inch lateral sewer along Vancouver avenue, from East Main street to East Eleventh street, and for the assessment of the cost thereof on the property directly benefited thereby and adjacent thereto, and providing a meeting of the Council to consider protests against said construction and assessment and the serving of the owners of such property with notice thereof.

The City of Medford doth ordain as follows:

Section 1. It is the intention of the Council to cause a lateral sewer to be constructed along Vancouver avenue, from East Main street to East Eleventh street, and to assess the cost thereof upon the property directly benefited thereby and adjacent thereto.

Section 2. The Council will hear and consider any protests against said construction and the assessing of said property for the cost thereof at a meeting of the Council to be held April 15, 1913, at 7:30 o'clock p. m. in the council chamber in said city, and all property owners of property adjacent to said sewer and benefited thereby are hereby called upon to appear before said Council at said time and place, and show cause, if any they have, why said construction should not be made and the cost thereof so assessed.

Section 3. The city recorder is hereby directed to serve notice thereof upon the property owners aforesaid, by causing three copies of this ordinance to be posted in three public places in said city, and said ordinance to be published once in a daily newspaper published and of general circulation in the city, at least ten days before the date of said meeting.
