FINISH TARIFF BILL SATURDAY PROMISE OF UNDERWOOD

WASHINGTON, May 1.—"I think we will finish the tariff bill in the house by Saturday night" declared Democratic Leader Underwood tonight after an all day debate on the iron and steel schedule.

All day and again tonight the democrats with their overwhelming majority bowled over all amendments proposed by the republicans and progressives. The ways and means committee, however, had carried a number of its own amendments all of minor character and designed to perfect the classification.

The iron and steel schedule was the particular target of attack by the republicans and progressives and Representative Palmer who is in charge of that schedule was frequently reminded that the Bethlehem Steel company was in his district.

Mann, republican leader and others charged the duty on ferro manganese was distinctly in the interest of the United States Steel corporation. Personalities were indulged in several times particularly in the discussion of the steel corporation and its holdings in Minnesota mines and concerning the Alabama iron companies.

BRYAN VISITS JAP SETTLEMENT AT SACRAMENTO

SACRAMENTO, Cal., May 1.—Japanese women working in the fields schools in which the Japanese children outnumber the white; a lone general store, owned by a discouraged native Californian competing against two flourishing Japanese establishments across the street, were the conditions at Florin, a little country town twelve miles from the capital.

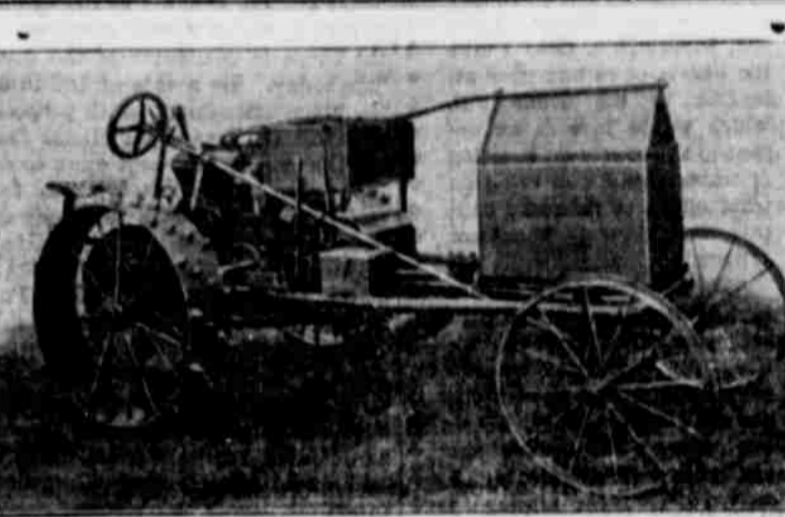
