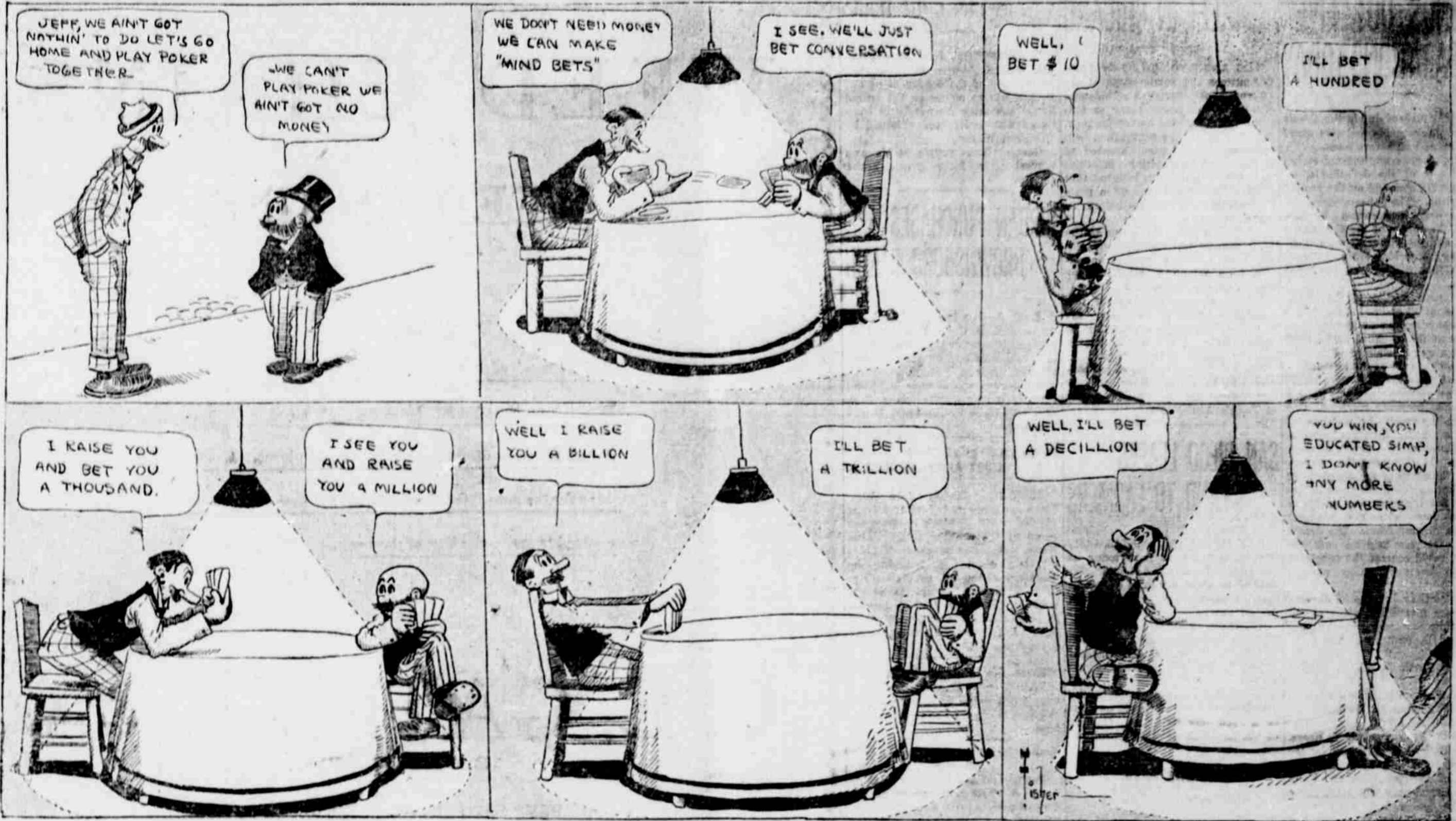


At That, Jeff Might Have Called Him
