

FIFTY MEN LOST ON GREAT LAKES DURING BLIZZARD

DETROIT, Nov. 12.—Though there was still a raging sea on the Great Lakes today, most of the vessels which have been held in lake ports by the storm which has tied up navigation since Sunday morning were preparing to sail.

Shipping men said it was too soon to estimate the extent of losses, but they could account for at least 50 men drowned and \$2,000,000 damage.

The Canadian shore was strewn with wreckage and a dozen boats were reported on the rocks at as many points along the shores of the lakes. With the storm apparently over and the sea gradually subsiding, it was believed however, that most of them would be saved.

The steamships Waldo and Turrent Chief, both of which were reported stranded, had gone down today, but their crews were saved.

MAN FOUND GUILTY UNDER NEW FRAUD AD LAW

PASADENA, Cal., Nov. 11.—Leo Misch was found guilty today of fraudulent advertising here in one of the first prosecutions in the state under the new law prohibiting misrepresentation of goods. Misch, it was shown, bought the tag-end of a stock of goods owned by a dealer in high-grade women's wear, added to

it a large quantity of inferior stock bought from outside jobbers, and advertised the whole as a \$50,000 bankrupt stock of the high-class merchandise. Sentence will be pronounced Friday by Justice Dunham.
