What is Thought of Blaine's Scheme.

In commenting on Blaine's new scheme for distributing the whisky tax, the Chicago Times says: In reality it is another device of protectionism striving to prevent any reduction or modification of the damnable tariff exactions. Nothing lets go its grip on the throat of a victim so unwillingly as licensed robbery. A Washington correspondent telegraphs: Judge Lowrey of Fort Wayne, who has been taking an active part in Carlisle's canvass, said Blaine's proposition was intolerable. It was the very quintessence of Federalism and centralization. There would soon cease to be local self-government if the states were to abolish their own taxation and look to the general government for their revenues. If the revenues were too large, the only thing to do was to reduce taxation.

The Sunday law is enforced after a peculiar fashion in Walla Walla. Seven of the twenty-six saloons of that city openly violate the law and every Monday they go before the local court and pay the penalty, with costs, making \$29.50 each. This money goes into the territorial school fund.
