In the house of representatives last Monday, Judge Payson of Illinois, introduced a bill declaring forfeited land grants of a large number of roads, involving many millions of acres of land.

The following, which illustrates the rapidity with which towns are built up in territories, was told the Northwestern Lumberman by a gentleman who was looking around in Dakota recently.

The Western Leader thinks that the temperance question will soon figure prominently in Oregon politics. There are probably more genuine temperance Democrats in the state than there are temperance Republicans.
