ROOSEVELT AGED 46

MILE POSTS IN LIFE OF THE PRESIDENT.

Has Led a Strenuous and Ambitious Existence for the Past Twenty-Five Years—Began His Manhood as a Graduate and a Tourist Through Europe—Has Been in Office Most of the Time Since Attaining His Majority.

Washington, D. C., Oct. 27.—For the fourth time President Roosevelt has passed a birthday anniversary in the White House. This was his 46th birthday and hundreds of congratulatory letters and telegrams arrived to remind him of the day. The cabinet room and the president's private office were filled with exquisite floral offerings. The president spent the greater part of the day in his office, and with Secretary Loeb attended to matters of business. At luncheon there were several guests in addition to the members of the president's family, and a considerable number of invitations were sent to intimate friends to attend a sort of an informal birthday dinner tonight.

Four French army officers are now on trial for using military funds to influence witnesses against Dreyfus at the time of his court-martial.

Roy Raymond, a crazy man, seized a locomotive at Eureka, Cal., Wednesday and ran it 12 miles in a mad flight, until the engine stalled for lack of steam.

The Dutch in South Africa have captured Batoe, the rebel leader, killed 196 of his followers, took 20 guns and only lost three soldiers of the German force.

All members of the first and second Japanese army reserves have been called home from all parts of the world. Six hundred beet field workers will go from Utah.

Rev. George Bell, of Philadelphia, publicly criticised the president for not taking a stand against the liquor traffic in his message. Bell says the president cannot be a Christian and pass by such a momentous evil as this.
