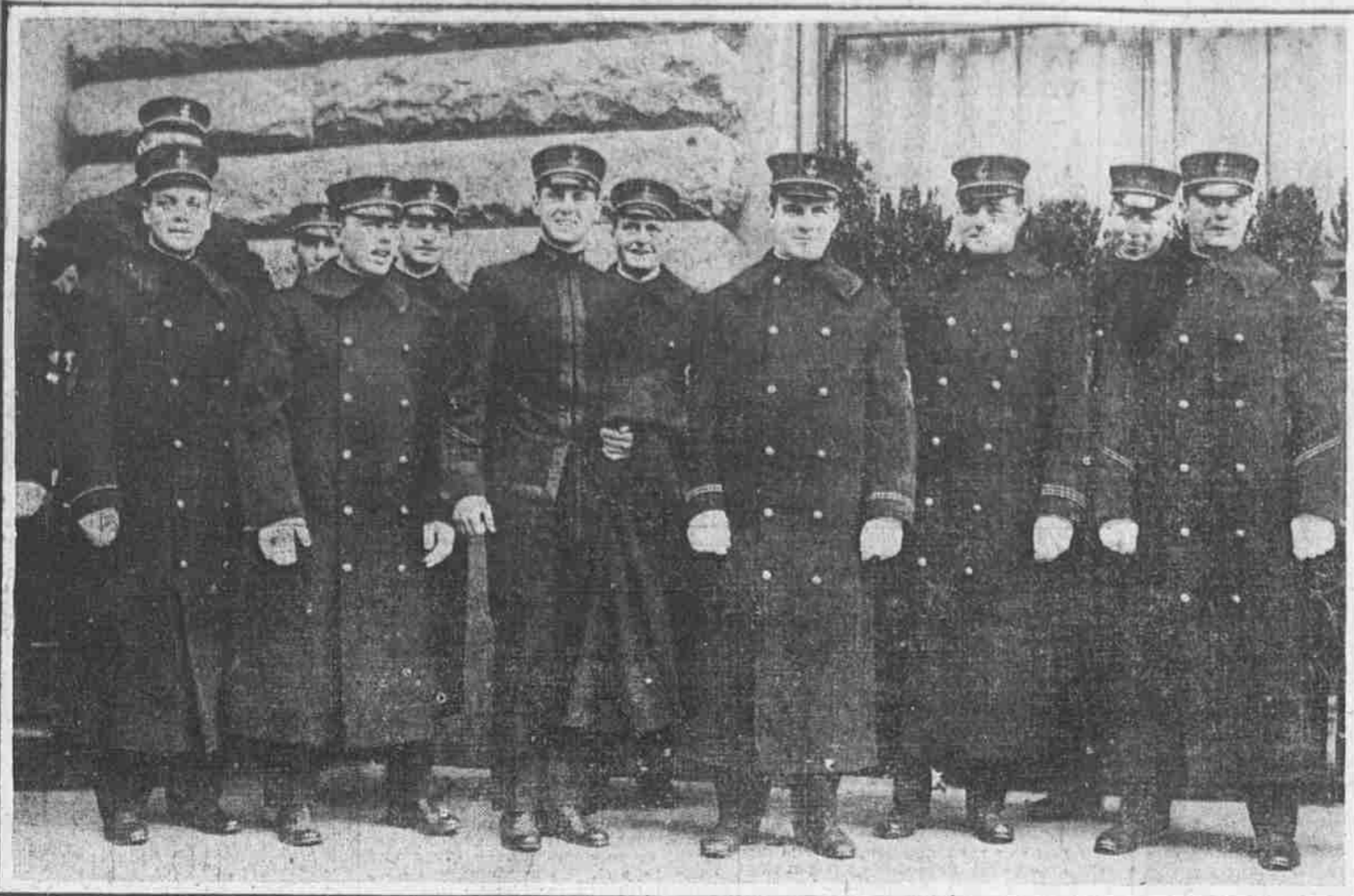

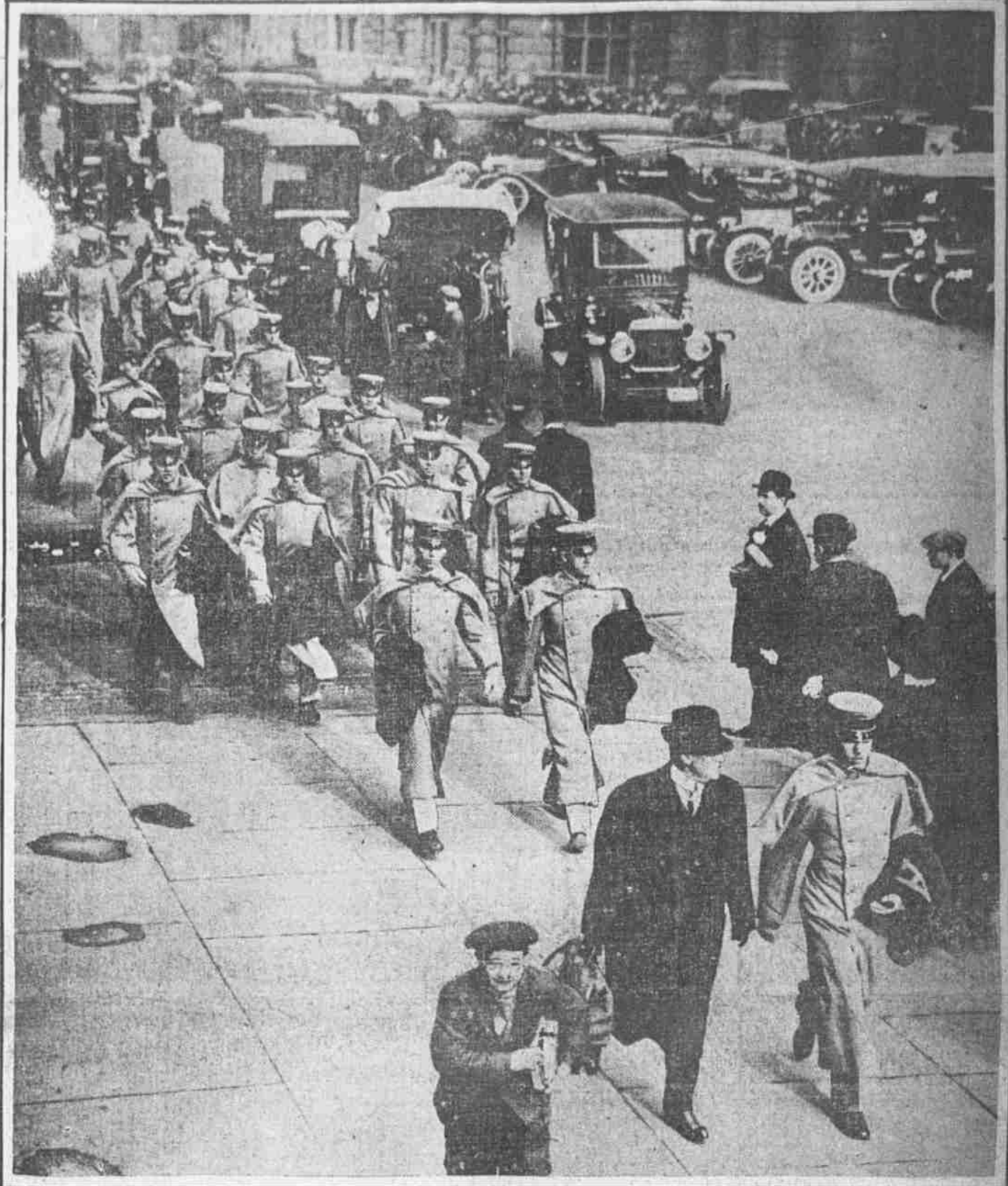

NAVY TEAM IN CADET UNIFORMS KINDLY POSE IN FRONT OF THEIR HOTEL.

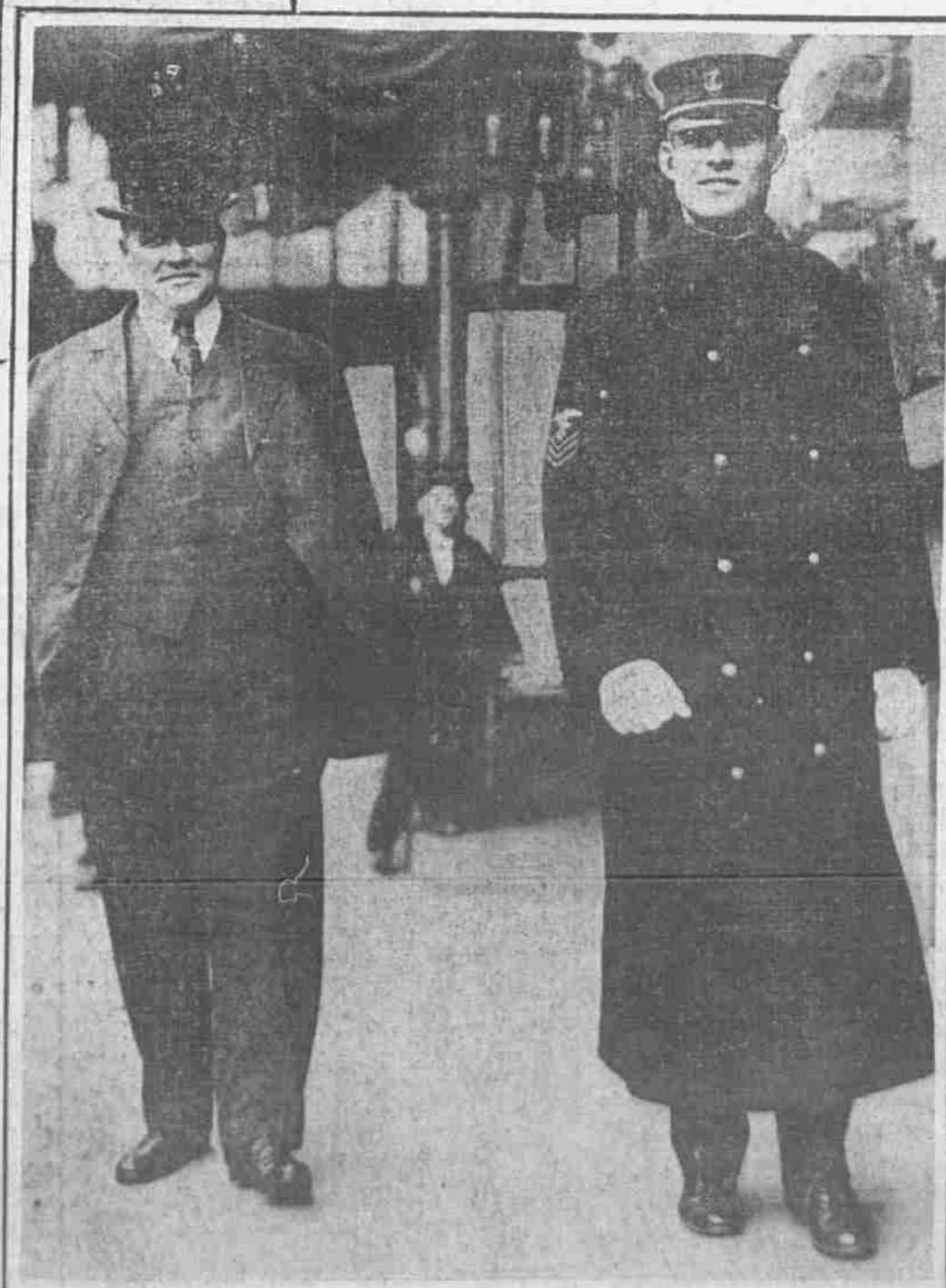


GRAY-CLAD ARMY CADETS MARCHING AROUND CITY HALL ON WAY TO HOTEL.

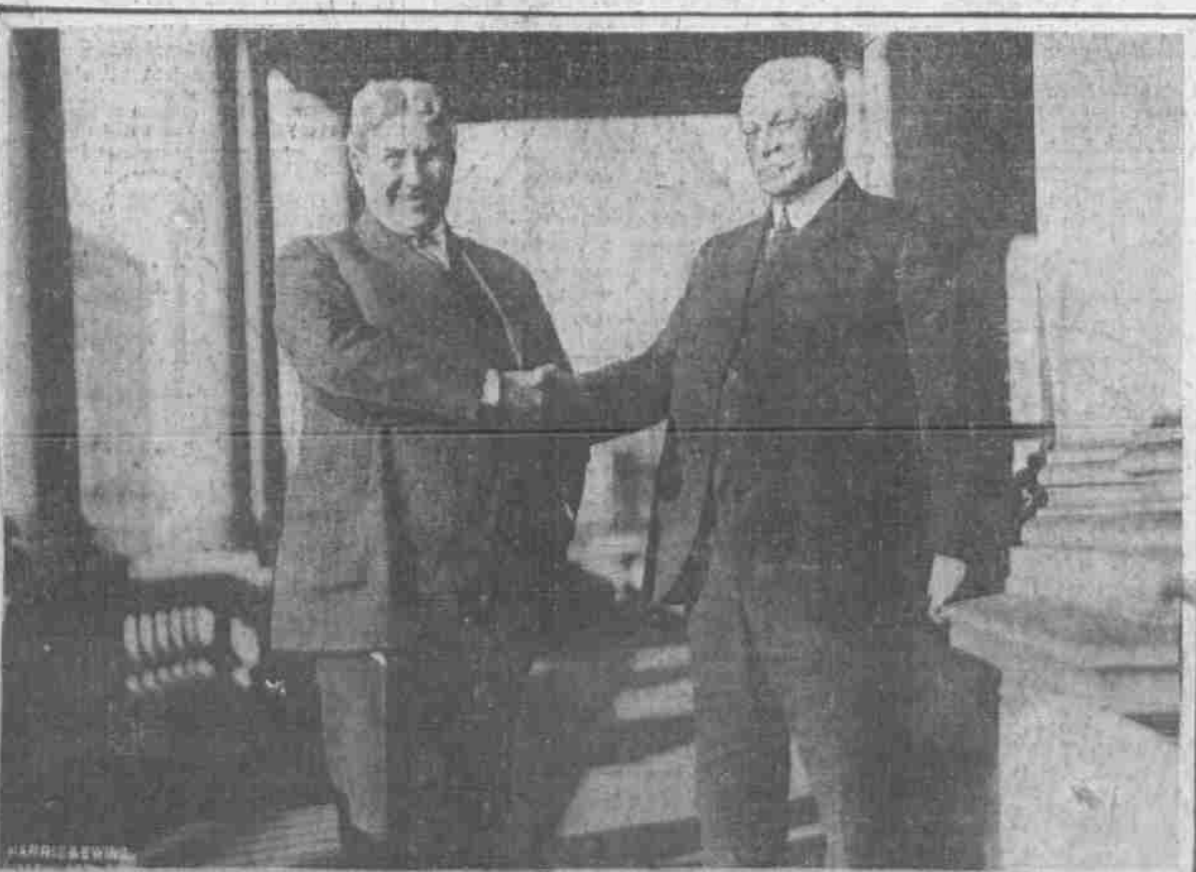
NAVY TEAM'S CAPTAIN JOINS FATHER HERE.
