Some golfer with lots of time on his hands has compiled a choice score for the past 14 years at the Ekwonok Country Club, where the national amateur championship was held this year.

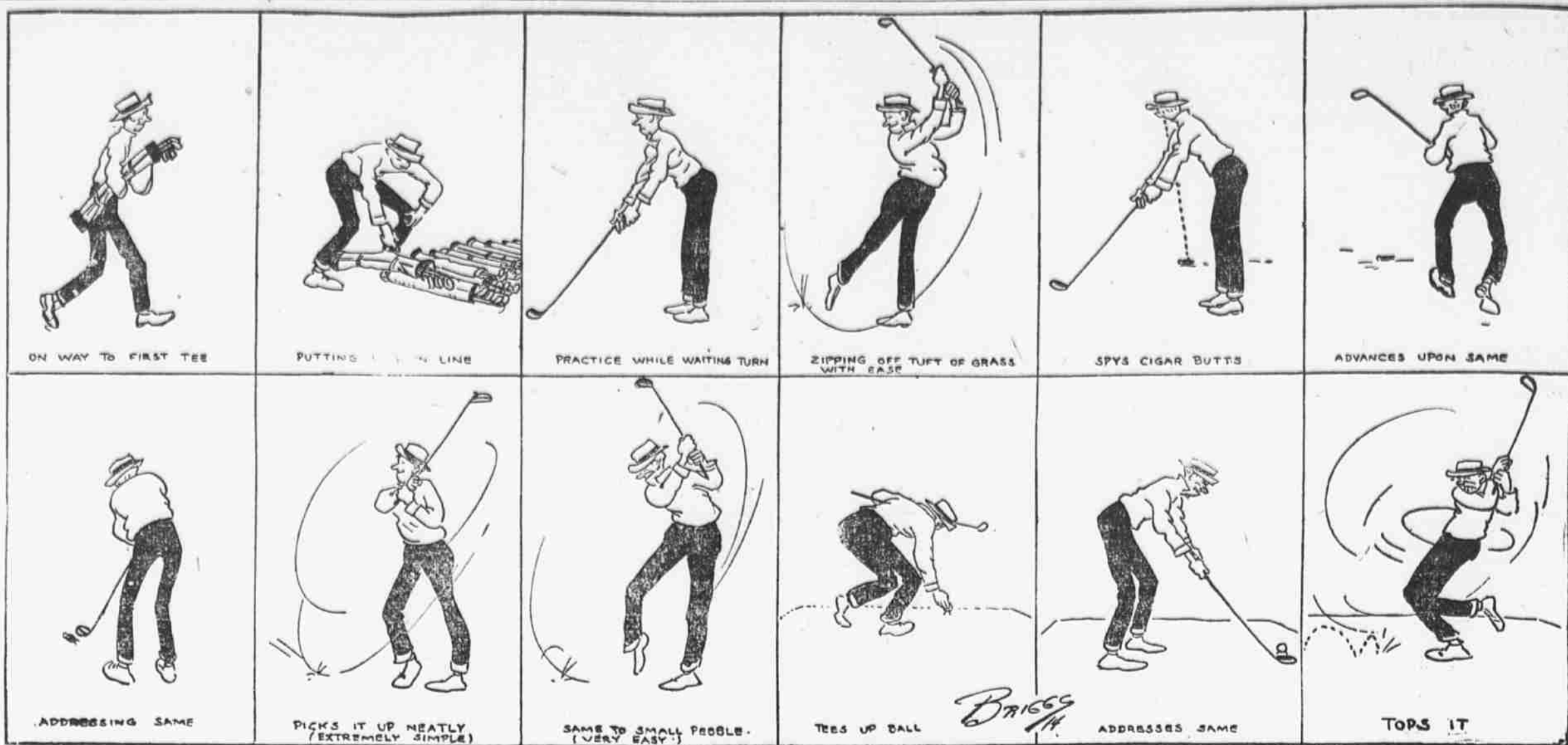
