As to the details of a plan for systematizing our benevolent provisions for the poor, we do not pretend now to speak; but will the idea be carried out in any specific and satisfactory manner? Will our several associations come into the measure, and agree to do so cordially and freely; or will a selfish reluctance to compromise to any extent their individuality prevent them from favoring such an enterprise?

It is, in short, there should be persons so ostentatiously humane, who conceive that their reputations depend so entirely on belonging to certain charitable missions or organizations that they cannot afford to give up any portion of their personal conspicuousness in order to effect a great public good, will they be permitted to frustrate the scheme? Let us hope not.
