1920 WAS GREAT YEAR ON TRACK AND FIELD

Outstanding Feature Was America's Olympic Triumph, Establishing Five New Records—Britons Won in Penn Relays—Red and Blue College Champions

TRACK and field sports enthusiasts have much to be happy over when they look back over 1920 and recover the many impressive victories and broke as many records as in any so-called best year of the past.

The magnificent victory of the track and field athletes in the Olympic games was the crowning feature of a wonderful year. The Yanks scored 212 points, 107 more than the second best country, Finland. The victory was all the more impressive when it is found that several of the American stars in the Olympic games were not declared until the last event on the program, when Maxam flashed home second in the four-mile relay.

Harold E. Barron, who sported the colors of West Philadelphia High in the recent days and afterwards the blue and white of Penn State, was his city's most conspicuous performer in the Olympics. In the semifinals Barron, club during his spare moments broke the world's record in the 100-meter hurdle race and in the final finished second.

Woodring's Victory Another boy who spent much of his time in the Olympic games was Woodring of the Meadowbrook Club, but whose home is in Bethlehem brought fame to this end of the country by finishing first in the final 400 meters race at Antwerp. Allan Woodring, the name of Bethlehem's first Olympic hero, Woodring represents Syracuse on the track during the college year.

Seven national records fell by the wayside during the course of the year. Aside from Lever's establishing of the 50-yard record, the 5000-meter run, 70-yard high hurdle, 100-yard low hurdle, 440-yard hurdles, javelin throw and the 3000-meter water throw were clipped.

On February 10, in the Millrose games, Thompson, of Indianapolis, broke the 70-yard record in 8.15 seconds. A short time later Carl Johnson pushed Thompson's mark in the 50-yard race to 7.45 seconds.

On June 29, in the Olympic tryouts at Antwerp, France, Hamilton won the 100-meter race in 16.8 seconds, a record for 100 yards in 9.35 seconds.

Other track incidents that stand out include the defeat of Cornell by Penn State in the 100-meter race, 16.8 to 17.4. It was the first Red and Blue victory over the Ithacans in many years.

On September 25, Lincoln, in New York, established a new American javelin record.

In the closing days of December, on the Ohio State championships of the colleges lost a close and exciting cross-country race with the combined Oxford-Cambridge team of 29 runners.
