Your everyday toilet is part of your character. A little girl who looks like a "fury" or a "sloven" in the morning is not to be trusted, however finely she may look in the evening.

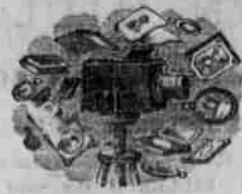
Look tidy in the morning, and after dinner work is over, improve your toilet. Make it a rule of your daily life to "dress up" for the afternoon.
